1. Wai Tai Concert, Roseneath School Hall, Thursday 28 July, 7:30 pm



Wai Tai, a combo formed a few years ago by Northlander Robyn Kamira (Te Rarawa), is coming to Wellington especially to play for Acoustic Routes and a real treat it will be! They play songs and tunes that blend maoritanga with the folk tradition, using guitars, percussion, banjo, fiddle, ukulele and vocals to achieve an excitingly original music – as anyone who has heard them here and there in their different manifestations can agree.



They themselves have described their music as 'contemporary Waiata fused into world sounds', and you can be sure of a fresh and memorable performance from their AR debut.


In support, we have two of our own community performing as a duo under the moniker **The PJs** – the P being Pamela Gerrish Nunn and the J being Jenny Kilpatrick. Together they deliver a repertoire of issue-based folk-songs old and new, utilising harmony and unison singing, recorder and bass guitar.

And **Chris Moses** has been a favourite at the Acoustic Routes open mic sessions, now we have him here on a concert night presenting a range of his own songs, blues and 20th-century classics accompanied by his powerful guitar-playing.

Admission \$15 members, \$20 non-members

Roseneath School Hall is a beautiful little space just out of the central city with good acoustics and a proper stage, lighting, etc.

Access is down a short lane off the street (Maida Vale), next to a church and a small row of shops. There's parking in the school grounds and the number 14 bus goes right past.

Hello everyone – kia ora katoa

The big event for Acoustic Routes this month is the annual AGM taking place on Saturday 30th, which you can see announced elsewhere in this issue.

As always, the club needs to find a committee of energetic and enthusiastic individuals (half a dozen or more) to take charge of the club's programme and generally pursue its mission of

promoting folk music in the region. The current president (that's me) and the current treasurer (Sue Ikin) are stepping down from those roles, and so far no other current committee member has stated their intention to stand for re-election. So, let me be clear, if the membership wishes the club to continue, candidates for a new committee must be found for election at the end of the month. Further, at the risk of being blunt, I'd say that it will not be useful for well-meaning members to put up their hands out of obligation but then just warm the seat - what Acoustic Routes needs at this time is a number of people with positive energy for the club's kaupapa, a clear idea of what they personally can contribute, and a team ethic or collective vision so that each member's effort is applied to the same end.

The club has more than 90 members currently - a healthy number, but if it is to continue that must translate into active interest on the part of at least a handful of them in organising the club's activities on a regular basis, putting our name about and getting attendance at concerts and other club events. I suppose I'm stating the obvious, but what makes an entity like AR sustainable is not only people signing up, but people actively involving themselves in realising its aims.

That doesn't have to be identical with what AR currently is and does, however. The club's activities can be reappraised by a new committee, and the kind of event, its frequency, its location, etc. can be altered to fit the incoming committee's capacity, as long as the aims of the constitution are honoured. (Anyone wanting to consult the club's constitution can find it on the website.) There are many new ideas just waiting for able, enthusiastic people to activate them. There are various ways of being a folk music club in the 21st-century city, and there is no reason why the practice we currently have shouldn't be tweaked or changed for another model which serves the needs and wishes of the membership.

So, think about this people, and by all means contact me in the coming weeks (phone 04-5504912) to chat about it, if you wish. Although the meeting doesn't have to be super-formal, it does have to conform to various conventions in order to be credible, so advance planning may help us to have a smooth-running meeting that achieves a satisfactory outcome for the future of the club. There's also the opportunity for discussion that the Strathean weekend offers, for those of you planning to go there mid-month.

5. Acoustic Routes AGM, Thistle Inn, 3 Mulgrave Street, Thorndon Saturday 30 July, 11 am



11. About Acoustic Routes

Acoustic Routes (Wellington Folk Centre Incorporated) is a club for people who enjoy playing and listening to folk and acoustic styles of music.

We have several regular events each month. The second Sunday of the month we host a singaround at Alfred Memmelink's Artspace on the Petone foreshore, from 5-7 pm.

The fourth Thursday of the month generally features a concert, usually with a visiting artist and support acts from amongst our membership. These concerts are at Roseneath School Hall, Maida Vale Road, Wellington.

Membership of Acoustic Routes costs \$25 a year for individuals, \$40 for couples or families, or \$15 for students and beneficiaries. It entitles you to door-charge discounts at Acoustic Routes events and also at events put on by most other folk clubs.
