# 2. AR Monthly Concert, Thursday 22 June, 7.30pm

We've got a double bill for this month's (all-female) concert.

#### FFFF Feisty Feckin' Full-time Feminists - Take The Whole Damn Rose-Bush



FFFF are: Therese O'Connell, Wendy Davis, Claire-Louise McCurdy, Sue Hirst, Emma Kelly, Marie Russell, Grace Millar and Jane Shallcrass.

Singing stars of the 1970s-1980s women's movement take the stage again with some new additions - reviving some of the songs they sang to keep spirits up on the picket line or at strategising sessions. Some of the lyrics were made up more or less on the spot to a borrowed tune, to mark a particular occasion; other songs came from feminists in Auckland, Australia or beyond.

Expect a roller-coaster ride through the politics of equal pay, discrimination, harassment and reproductive rights, with lashings of fighting spirit. The group will explain the background and in some cases put the words up for audience participation. Audience advisory: frequent use of strong language.

### Renny and Janet

Folk/Indie musician Renny M, sings directly into your heart - dusty vocals, skilful narrative and melodic invention combine as she intertwines her melodic fingerpicking guitar style with heartfelt lyrics that emanate raw emotion.

Renny M transforms the everyday into sublime moments and her songs explore the experiences that bring us to life. These are songs of love, longing and loss, sung with a voice the flavour of bittersweet.

Renny met Janet at the local singer/songwriter night and was impressed by her humour and quick wit, as well as her beautiful mandolin riffs.



A founding member of the iconic kiwi covers band Gumboot Tango, Janet needs no introduction for those of us who have enjoyed her favourite activity – jamming hard out at music festivals. She adds tasteful backing vocals to Renee's beautiful songs, and has been known to perform one or two of her own in the set.

There may be an opportunity for a couple of floor spots from women performers so come prepared if you'd like to do a number or two.

#### Admission \$10 members, \$15 non-members

Venue – the strengthened and refurbished Roseneath School Hall.

Access is down a short lane off the street (Maida Vale), next to a church and a small row of shops. There's parking in the school grounds and the number 14 bus goes right past.

The venue is the upstairs room at "The Office" bar in Newtown's main street, Riddiford St, just south of the intersection with Rintoul St. It's a very good space for live music, with food and drink available from the bar downstairs.

## 5. Festival review, Hamsterfest

It's hard to find what to say. Somehow the weather managed to not land a catastrophe on us, and we had an amazing and satisfying festival!

Every single item heard during the blackboards was top class, and how often does that happen? Everyone who played: thank you, you were wonderful, and please \*please\* come again. And it was a special delight to be able to feature Lott Larsson's group with Jamie (I think?) and Yvette Audain (congrats for winning the Bawdy Ballads trophy against stiff competition), and then Helen Stewart and Vrnda Yvrin Page in the final concert - the quality of music was incredible, and it's a real delight of the festival that music like that just cheerfully walks in our front gate.

This is our third year out at Matangi in partnership with Te Iwi o Haua Marae, and we're deeply grateful to them, the Matangi Hillcrest Sports Club (who operate the building), and the Waikato District Council (who operate the grounds) for giving us a home. We might've had early reservations but the welcome they've given us, and the work they've been doing in developing the venue in the last few years, is something we wouldn't get elsewhere.

And after they filled in for a caterer last year we were dead eager to get food from the marae again, and they stepped right up and served up delicious kai all weekend.

The guests were uniformly amazing, and a HUGE thank you to all of them. Noel Armstrong and West of the Divy gave us a wonderful time on Saturday night. And PLott - Lott Larsson and Paul Symons (again!). What a great morning (and late-night session) you gave us, thank you deeply.

We've all been watching RhodeWorkz for some years now and all of it's been a wonder. We had no hesitation at all in putting this incredible group on the same billing as international guests, and watching the entire hall light up for them was magic.

And then: how fortunate were we to have these two? Guitarist Dave Flynn from Ireland, weaving magic and music and damn good craic. Those of us who merely strum just shut up and listened, as the melodies weaving around the songs moved from one rhythm to another and then another before somehow becoming another

tune. And then he did it \*again\*. And Claire Hastings from Scotland, with song after song of sheer soaring beauty. \*And\* in the Gaelic, making those poor humble ones of us with only one language melt in envy and gratitude.

There's so many people to thank for everything they put in. If our maths is right (mine usually isn't) that was the 49th festival that HAMC has put on, so we're hoping to get something even more special going down next year.

We hope everyone got home safely, that Brian Stabb heals up quickly, that tents get dried out, that grass clippings get washed out (... we'll talk to the council about that for next year), and that we'll see you all next year.

Acoustic Routes (Wellington Folk Centre Incorporated) is a club for people who enjoy playing and listening to folk and acoustic styles of music.
