Last month there was a very entertaining house concert, in our home by Scot, Alistair Brown. He sang lots of lovely and interesting songs introduced with witty repartee and very funny jokes and stories. A thoroughly enjoyable evening.

Last Thursday was the concert night at Roseneath. First was Crooked Weather, a young English couple who perform beautiful harmonies and very creative instrumental work. A sign of where our music may head in the future - lovely. They were followed by the Faustians, Helena's latest and, may I say, greatest new group. Helena, Philip and Ruby presented a captivating hour of music that included wonderfully tight instrumentals, beautiful harmonies, and infectious rhythms. 6. Review, the Faustians and Crooked Weather, 22 February

Acoustic Routes' first concert for the year was a good 'un, featuring two quite different acts that complemented each other very nicely.

Opening the night we had Crooked Weather, an English duo who are touring New Zealand. Back home in Yorkshire, Holly and Will normally play in a four-piece with drums and bass. Here, we saw them stripped back to two acoustic guitars and vocals, but their set of self-penned songs worked well in that format. Reflective songs for the most part, with some edgy guitar breaks from Will, making good use of his foot pedals. "Rabbit Holes" was a good example of that, an older song of theirs with a rocky break. We heard one locally inspired song, "Stoney Bay Blues", written after a visit to the Coromandel. They wrapped up their set with an element of theatre, coming down off the stage to give us the vibrations of their foot-stomping accompaniment to "When I See You Again".

The Faustians, who kept us engrossed us for the second half of the evening, also added a touch of the theatrical to their set, which I'll come back to shortly. They formed in 2016 as an old-time band centred on Helena's wonderful claw-hammer style banjo, fiddle and vocals, with Philip's deft accompaniment on guitar, and Ruby cementing it all together with her bass and backing vocals. In keeping with the music, they sang and played through a single old fashioned microphone called Myrtle, which delivered a natural and well-balanced sound to the audience.

As to be expected, the Faustians gave us a selection of traditional songs and tunes, reflecting Helena's immersion in Appalachian mountain music. Mixed with that were Helena's own songs, in the old-time style, but with lyrics evoking some nice touches of humour and wry observation. An example: her "anti-gospel" song "Ride for Glory" - sounds like gospel but with a different message. Another stand out was Helena's hurricane story, "Knit One Purl", about an old lady in a wheel chair who calmly carried on knitting as the flood water rose to her waist.



Then on to the first public performance of The Faustians homemade"crankie", a scroll of images (drawn by Helena) cranked across a lightbox to the accompaniment of an old Doc Watson ballad. It was low-tech and old fashioned with the appeal of the magic lantern shows that entranced audiences in the past. A final song, "Cumberland Gap", wrapped up a charming evening.

Lead singer of iconic AUS/Irish band Riogh, Danny's rich, powerful voice is described as going right into your soul. Now based in NZ, he has added mandolin and

guitar to his set. Erin silenced the Balladeer at Wellyfest 2017 with her renditions of 'Red Dirt Girl' and 'Damn The Dam' and lifted the room with her trademark driving rhythm guitar, with a soulful take of 'Jolene'. Frank's voice has been described as Doc Watson-like, and his picking as "brilliant, yet understated".

Acoustic Routes (Wellington Folk Centre Incorporated) is a club for people who enjoy playing and listening to folk and acoustic styles of music.

The fourth Thursday of the month generally features a concert, usually with a visiting artist and support acts from amongst our membership. Check the website or the Balladeer for updates about the venue.
