4. Wellington Regional Folk Foundation AGM, Sprig and Fern, Tinakori Road, 28 March, 2pm

The Wellington Regional Folk Foundation Inc organises each year's Wellington Folk Festival (Wellyfest). The AGM is your opportunity to learn how the festival went last year from the festival's Annual Reports and accounts. If you're keen to be involved and contribute to the running of Wellyfest there will be opportunities for new members to join the committee.

The committee currently has the maximum allowed 10 members but two of last year's committee have indicated they will not stand again. We are looking for a secretary (minutes, official record keeping and meeting management) and would be happy if someone would consider joining us to assist with practical organisation - especially the volunteer and/or contracted teams that look after: the festival gate - registrations, cash takings, security; and site hygiene.

Nominations for committee members are welcome. Nominees need to agree to accept nomination so if the nominee cannot attend the AGM we will need their agreement to be nominated in writing and in advance.

5. Review, Acoustic Routes February concert featuring Butter Wouldn't, Melt, Head Full of Bees, & Stephen Riddell

This was a tremendous start to our concert programme for 2021. It was another super variety show and variety was certainly on offer from **Stephen Riddell**, who opened the concert. He sang a selection from his recently released CD, "Sonic Space", accompanied by melodical guitar and harmonica. They included "Buddha of the Backwoods", a song that's been getting some international attention and a Gallipoli tale: "Your Fair Face".

Then we had **Head Full of Bees**, who we were keen to hear again after they first performed at last year's Wellyfest. This trio, featuring the big, rich voice of Simon Harnden, with Henry Burton-Woods on bouzouki and vocals and Jay Kenyon (cello and vocals), performs sea shanties and Celtic instrumentals. This combination, with full vocal harmonies and the unusual pairing of cello and bouzouki, sets this band apart from other performers of these musical genres. Their delivery of well-known sea songs such as "Blood Red Roses" and of course "Soon May the Wellerman Come", entwined with the tunes, did create quite a buzz I have to say, and drew an encore.

After the break, our second trio of the evening was **Butter Wouldn't Melt**, who have been steadily building a profile around Wellington and further afield. They have two strong vocalists, Andrea Reid and Nick Burfield. Nick drives the songs on his vintage arch-top guitar and Andrea colours them on whistles and dulcimers. Underpinning all that is Derek Burfield on double bass. They performed all originals, including several

sweet love songs that definitely melted more than a few hearts in the audience, who insisted on an encore. Their set also included a couple of powerful dark songs – one set in the Napier earthquake of 1931 and one about the murder of a young women during construction of Wellington's Mount Vic tunnel, with its haunting "no light at the end of the tunnel" refrain. **Butter Wouldn't Melt** are working on their first album and after seeing them at this concert, I'm looking forward to that.

A small donation to cover the venue hire will be welcome.


