#### 4. Announcing the Winners of the 2023 Joan Prior Awards



Acoustic Routes has had a strong response to the Joan Prior Award again this year. Seven young performers will receive the award - five solo performers and one duo.

- \*Ella Doty and Toby Sussex Folk Americana Pop/Rock.
- \*Fergus Cardwell-Dray (Fergus CD) Indie Folk Rock.
- \*Abbey Vietnamese singer-songwriter, R&B.

The award winners will receive full weekend passes to Wellington Folk Festival at Labour Weekend, where they will feature in a Young Performers concert on the Saturday.

Following the Festival, the JPA winners will appear in a special Young Performers Showcase at the Moon Bar in Newtown, on Sunday, November 5. It will be hosted by Don Mackay, who runs the popular Songs6021 concerts there. Newtown Festival will also be supporting the Showcase again this year.
