6. Review of the AR September concert featuring Barry and Lorna Swallow, with Stephen Hill and Beans Wright

Another lovely concert, with some very thought-provoking original songs in the first half and great renditions of 'covers' and tunes in the second.

Stephen Hill

Stephen started us off with some of his songs penned over the past few years. He is an ex-pat Irishman who now lives in the Hutt Valley. I first saw him a month or two ago at the Open Mic in Plimmerton, and was very impressed with his voice, songs, and general sense of gravitas. It was great to see him with the scope to sing for a longer set. Some of his songs were on quite difficult (but relatable) subjects, such as farewelling loved one from a



distance during COVID lockdown. Stephen accompanied himself on guitar, harmonica and by whistling!

Beans Wright

A ex-pat Brit from Yorkshire, Beans has a quirky songwriting style, with a performance style to match. It's always rewarding to listen to their lyrics, and I was pleased that the acoustics in the new venue measured up, with great sound by Stephen Riddell, using our new sound system. Also some songs with a serious message, such the tenacity of the human spirit, and drink-driving. In their typical way of turning things on their head, Beans's song from the point of view of the inner child being left behind by their "grown-up on the outside" was very satisfying.

What a delight to hear Barry and Lorna perform a whole set as I've only heard them in short bursts at festival singarounds before. A nice mix of Barry's favourite traditional and contemporary material, with some entertaining stories about his engagement with the artists or the material, and lovely backing from Lorna on her low whistles. We got to hear songs by Ralph McTell, Nic Jones, Nick Hart, Dave Burland (the very long 'Cawsand Bay' and Gerry Farrell. They were complemented by waltzes 'The Duke of York's Troops', 'Miss Rowan Davies', and others, played by Lorna on low

whistles, backed by Barry on guitar. I'm looking forward to hearing more of them in October as they will be at Wellyfest managing the Walker Trust Young Performance Award.
